Through our trauma-informed approach, we provide education, guidance, and emotional support for families navigating complex systems.



According to the Missouri
Department of Social Services, there are over 4,000 children in foster care in the St. Louis region alone. LFCS is doing our part to create a legacy of restoration- helping children find the stability they need today while laying the groundwork for a better tomorrow.



Early childhood education plays a critical role in shaping a child's future, and studies show that early learning opportunities are key to improving future graduation rates. When children have access to quality education alongside basic needs like food, healthcare, and stable housing, they are more likely to succeed academically. Missouri's overall graduation rate is higher than that of St. Louis at 91%, highlighting the critical need for accessible early education in our community.
